

Provide first aid as required. (e.g. DRSABCD and 100% Oxygen).

Call Emergency Services 000 or 112 or Divers Emergency Services 1800 088 200.

Prepare for transportation to nearest Hyperbaric chamber if advised.



## Secure the site and equipment

 Tag out all dive equipment involved in the incident. Do not alter equipment or turn off dive cylinders, secure site and record details.



## Collect essential information and first aid response

- Injured diver/s names, condition? i.e. conscious? require resuscitation? obvious major injury/ problem?
- Progressive state of patient/s e.g. stable, good colour, getting worse? Brief diving history relating to incident?
- Medical equipment on site and treatment delivered.
- Patient's full recent diving history for at least the preceding 48 hours.
- · Copies of dive logs and paperwork.
- Recent and longer term medical history of patients e.g. colds, previous injuries, medications etc.
- Names, addresses and medical training of people involved in treatment.
