
This guide will assist you to install the Citrix Workspace App and connect to VirtualApps in macOS on a personal Apple Macintosh computer.

Procedure

1. Open your Web Browser, navigate to your Okta Dashboard and log in

You can get to the Dashboard by selecting 'Flinders dashboard (Okta)' from the 'Quick Links' menu on the Flinders website

2. Select the VirtualApps Okta app tile (you can search for it in the tool bar if it's not visible)

- 4. If the Citrix Workspace is detected, the application will launch. If no window appears, select the **check box** to agree to the Citrix License Agreement and click **Download**


7. Select **Allow** to determine if your device is compatible

9. Select Continue then Agree to the licence agreement




10. Select **Install** and enter your computer's **Username** and **Password** when prompted


13. Citrix Workspace should start automatically. Enter **flinders.cloud.com** in the text box and select **Continue**
